HISTORY

The City of La Mesa's Community Relations and Veterans Commission was created in 2016 after two City commissions were merged to provide for a more comprehensive Commission to serve senior adults, the disabled, veterans and the community-at-large.

PURPOSE

To provide a forum for discussion on community and human relations issues facing all individuals and groups but in particular those of our senior adults, disabled and veterans.

To increase awareness of activities, events, and organizations serving senior adults, disabled and veterans

To promote positive community relations by planning, participating in, or sponsoring, as appropriate, inclusive activities that support and serve all community groups including seniors, disabled and veterans.

MEETINGS

The Commission consists of nine (9) resident electors of the City of La Mesa appointed by the Mayor and approved by the City Council. All members are non-paid volunteers appointed for four year terms. Two members each represent seniors, disabled, and veterans and three members represent the community at large.
